The Clarke Family Nurse Practitioner program has a 100% board passage rate and a 100% employment rate. Our graduates take positions within an approximate 200-mile radius.

Graduates of Clarke's Doctor of Physical Therapy program have a 98% pass rate on the licensure exam and a 100% employment rate.

9 out of 10 graduates report their Clarke graduate degree gave them the opportunity to improve critical thinking, analytical reasoning, and communication skills.

Debra Gallagher, RN, BSN, from Gay Mills, Wis., and Andrea Simmons, MSN, RN, CPN, of Belmont, Wis., were awarded \$2,000 scholarships to registered nurses who demonstrate the potential of making a contribution to nursing in Wisconsin. Simmons is a nursing education specialist for surgical services at the University of Wisconsin Hospital/American Family Children's Hospital.
