DR. MOSHE SZYF JAMES MCGILL PROFESSORSHIP AND GLAXOSMITHKLINE-CIHR CHAIR IN PHARMACOLOGY AND THERAPEUTICS MCGILL UNIVERSITY, MONTREAL, QUEBEC

Dr. Szyf is the founding co-director of the Sackler Institute for Epigenetics and Psychobiology at McGill and is a Fellow of the Canadian Institute for Advanced Research Experience-based Brain and Biological Development program. His lab proposed that DNA methylation is a prime therapeutic target in cancer and other diseases and has postulated and provided the first set of evidence that "social environment" early in life can alter DNA methylation—launching the emerging field of "social epigenetics."
