COURSES

HIST 101 Western Civilization I-Western Civilization from Ancient times through 1848

HIST 102 Western Civilization II-Western Civilization from 1848 through the present

HIST 107 US History I -Colonization of North America through 1865

HIST 108 United States History II-United States History from 1865 through the present

POLI 120 American National Government (MAY BE APPLIED to a History major)-An investigation of the system of government and politics in the United States.

HIST/POLI 200 Introduction to Primary Research-An investigation into research sources available in government, public and private historical archives, libraries and museums.

HIST 205 Modern Asian History-An investigation into the political, economic and social development of Asia as a world force.

HIST 208 Modern Latin American History-An investigation into the political, economic and social development of Latin American countries.

HIST/POLI 210 Modern World Politics-An investigation into political trends around the world within an historical perspective.

HIST 280 History Topics:-The subject matter will change each time this course is offered.
