WE OFFER A VARIETY OF MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUTSTANDING ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AS WELL AS TALENT IN A VARIETY OF FIELDS. THE FOLLOWING IS A LIST OF CURRENT MERIT AWARDS FOR FULL-TIME FIRST-YEAR UNDERGRADUATES IN THE DAYTIME ACADEMIC PROGRAM.

CLARKE ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

Students are considered for a Clarke Academic Scholarship upon completion of their admissions file. Award amounts range from \$9,000 to \$13,000 and are determined based on cumulative high school GPA and ACT/SAT score.

Students who show the potential to impact vibrancy and contribute to campus life are awarded the Campus Impact Grant, up to \$3,000. Students must live on campus to receive this award.

FINANCIAL AID OFFERINGS FOR TRANSFERS

CLARKE UNIVERSITY OFFERS A VARIETY OF MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUTSTANDING ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AS WELL AS TALENT IN A VARIETY OF FIELDS. BELOW IS A LIST OF CURRENT MERIT AWARDS FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATES TRANSFERRING INTO THE DAYTIME ACADEMIC PROGRAM.

TRANSFER ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

Students who transfer in to Clarke are considered for a Transfer Academic Scholarship upon completion of their admissions file. Award amounts range from \$8,000 to \$12,000. Recipients must have college credit beyond receiving a high school diploma or equivalent. Students who have attended more than one institution will be awarded based on the cumulative GPA earned at all accredited institutions attended.

PHI THETA KAPPA

Transfer students with membership in Phi Theta Kappa Honors Society (PTK) will be awarded a renewable Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship of \$16,800. This award replaces the student's Transfer Academic Scholarship. This award is given once membership is confirmed.

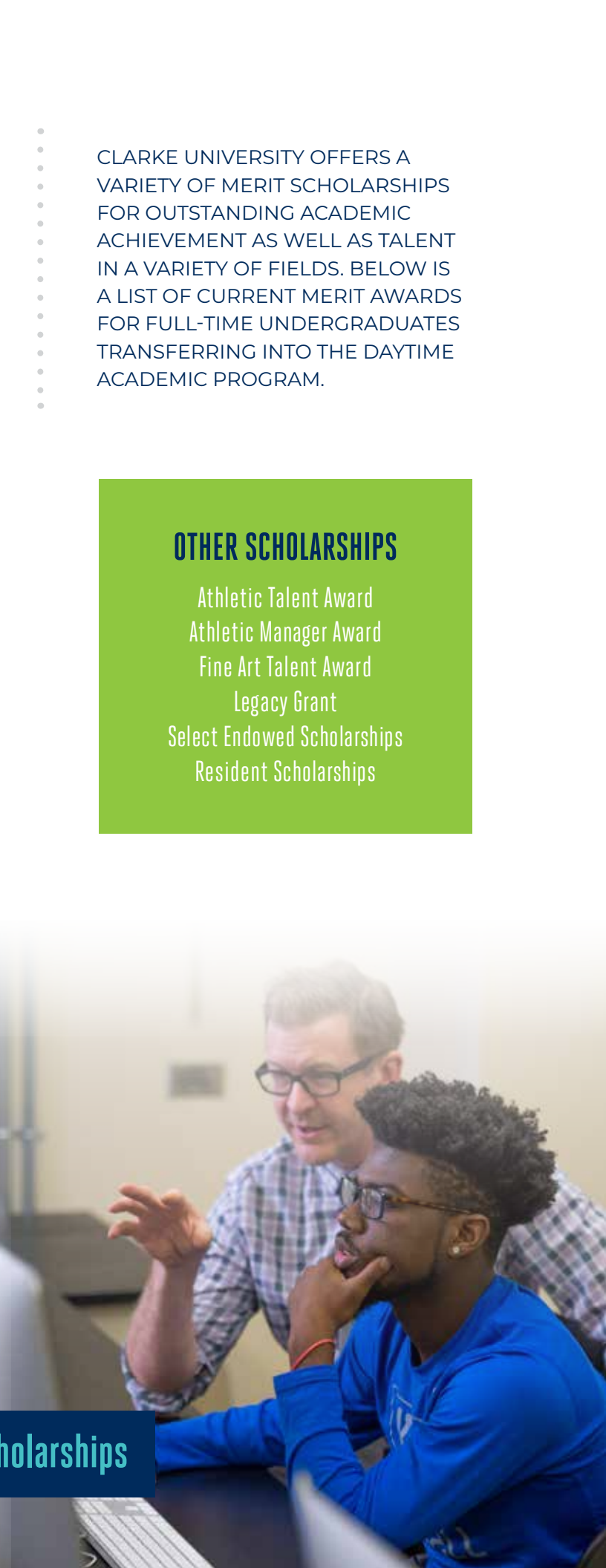
CAMPUS IMPACT GRANT

FEDERAL AND STATE GRANTS

All students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be eligible to receive state or federal funding, including loans and federal work-study. The FAFSA can be filed after October 1 at fafsa.ed.gov.

OUTSIDE SCHOLARSHIPS

We encourage students to apply for outside or private scholarships. Talk to your Clarke admissions counselor for more resources. Check with your high school guidance office, service organizations within your community, and your parent's employers for possible scholarship opportunities.

FEDERAL DIRECT SUBSIDIZED AND UNSUBSIDIZED LOAN	Up to \$5,500 total for the first year between the subsidized and unsubsidized loan.	Awarded to eligible students who complete the FAFSA. Will be included in financial aid award letter if eligible.
FEDERAL DIRECT PLUS PARENT LOAN	Up to the cost of attendance minus other aid.	Online application process at clarke.edu/parentplus .
STUDENT PRIVATE LOANS	Up to the cost of attendance minus other aid.	Must apply independently with lender. Approval subject to credit check. In most cases, a credit-worthy cosigner is needed. Visit clarke.edu/privateloans for more information.
