

ABDOMINAL PAIN

Pain located in a specific region of the abdomen, or generalized abdominal discomfort.

1. Do not use any pain medicine stronger than Tylenol, unless doctor orders stronger medicine. Follow instructions.
2. Do not use a laxative.
3. If you have been instructed to strain your urine, be sure to do so each time you void (urinate).
4. If any of the following occur, please contact your private physician.
 - a. pain worsens or becomes localized
 - b. pain is not gone after 12 hours
 - c. fever develops or rises
 - d. you begin vomiting or vomit more frequently
 - e. you have blood in your urine, stool, or vomit

Symptoms can include:

- nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, constipation
- urinary discomfort
- fever
- change in recent dietary intake
