ARTICULATION AGREEMENT WITH EDGEWOOD COLLEGE

Edgewood College currently provides courses for students to meet the requirements for the Social Work Training Certificate issued by the state of Wisconsin. Currently, these courses use the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) competencies to guide the material taught. Additionally, many of the courses are taught by instructors holding MSW degrees and/or use social work texts. Finally, these courses are taught at a level equivalent to MSW foundation level courses. Therefore, Clarke University will accept some of these courses as transfer equivalents of courses required for the MSW degree. The table below specifies courses that will be accepted from Edgewood College students who are accepted into the Clarke University MSW program. Students must earn a "B" or better in order for the courses to be eligible for transfer.
