ARTICULATION AGREEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-PLATTEVILLE (UW-P)

UW-P provides courses for students to meet the requirements for the Social Work Training Certificate issued by the state of Wisconsin. Currently, these courses use the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) competencies to guide the instructed material. Therefore, Clarke University will accept some of these courses as transfer equivalents required for the MSW degree. The table below specifies courses that will be accepted from UW-P graduates who are admitted into Clarke's MSW program. Students must earn a "B" or better in order for the courses to be eligible for transfer.

CSWE does not allow field hours to transfer from unaccredited programs. All students are required to complete at least 910 hours of field experience within CSWE-accredited programs.
